Projects Closed In line with our government's directives, we have closed all three of our projects in Kibera - our school, transition programme and community library. Our teachers have prepared some worksheets for the kids to work on at home and our school students have carried their textbooks home. The Ministry of Education is also broadcasting lessons over the radio so we've been letting parents know this service is available.

Taking precautions in Kibera We're hopeful that the government's quick and bold response will help to contain the virus and reduce its impact. In Kibera, thousands of people live in very close quarters, sanitation is poor and people don't have piped water in their homes. Many people are in poor health and have underlying health issues that increase their vulnerability to COVID19. We love our community and we're searching for the best ways we can protect the most vulnerable and support families who are struggling. At this point, we're really praying that the Corona Virus will pass over Kibera.

Homes in Kibera do not have piped water, people buy water from nearby water points. To help people practise regular handwashing, we've set up some free handwashing stations outside our projects in Kibera. We've also put up posters from the CDC translated into Kiswahili with info on how to stop the spread of germs.
